

## Bulky Waste (Sperrmüll)

Yes! This is bulky waste:	No! This is NOT bulky waste:
Bedsteads, mattresses, sofas, cupboards and wardrobes, chairs and armchairs, tables, bicycles, prams, cookers, washing machines, dishwashers	Rubble, windows, wood panels, doors, sanitary fittings, garden waste, bags or cardboard boxes containing household rubbish, car parts, wastepaper and glass.

Bulky waste is collected on application. Application forms can be obtained from the dustmen, from the Bürgerinfozentrum (citizen information centre), from the Stadtteilbüros (district offices) or from the Entsorgungsbetriebe Lübeck (waste removal plant), Malmöstr. 22.

## Cooling Appliances, Household Waste Containing Harmful Substances

Yes! These items are collected:	No! These items are NOT collected:
<b>Cooling appliances:</b> Refrigerators, deep freezers, air conditioning units  <b>Harmful substances:</b> Varnish, paint, glue, cleaning agents, pesticides, fluorescent tubes, chemicals, batteries	Please make sure no food is left behind in the cooling appliances.  Used oil – please return to dealer. Drugs – please return to pharmacy.

Cooling appliances and harmful substances are collected on application. The Entsorgungsbetriebe Lübeck (waste removal office) will give you the date in writing. Recyclinghöfe (recycling sites) will accept a normal amount of toxic household waste and 1 cooling appliance per household free of charge.

## Recycling Sites

Yes! These items will be accepted:	No! These items will NOT be accepted:
Any amount of harmful substances that is normal for one household, corks, paper, cardboard, glass, old clothes, packaging marked with the "Grüner Punkt" ("green-dot" label), *cooling appliances, *packing material, *small amounts of rubble, *bulky waste, *garden refuse (1m3 max.)	Used oil – please return to dealer. Drugs – please return to pharmacy.  Unpacked waste containing asbestos (e.g. window boxes, corrugated fibre cement panels, insulation wool)

## Grey Bin

Yes! Put these items into the Grey Bin:	No! Do NOT put these items into the Grey Bin:
Ashes, cigarette ends, dirt, light bulbs, ceramics, pieces of china and pottery, cloths and sponges, dust bags, cotton wool, disposable nappies, sanitary articles	Plastics, metals, paper, glass, packaging, garden refuse and biodegradable waste, rubble, items containing harmful substances, such as batteries, paint and varnish

A subscription to the Grey Bin can be taken out or cancelled in writing only by the real estate owner or the real estate manager.



## Bottle Banks and Wastepaper Containers

Yes! Wastepaper and used glass includes:	No! Wastepaper and used glass does NOT include:
<p><b>Used glass:</b> White and coloured bottles (separate containers), jars and glasses</p> <p><b>Wastepaper:</b> Newspapers, magazines, books, exercise books, slips of paper, writing and wrapping paper, envelopes, letters, computer listing paper, glossy magazines, catalogues, cardboard, cardboard boxes, brochures, advertising letters</p>	<p>Windowpanes, ceramics, stoneware, pieces of china or pottery, light bulbs, fluorescent tubes, plastics, metals.</p> <p>Items containing harmful substances, such as batteries, paint and varnish.</p> <p>Plastics, plastic bags, foodstuff, wood, textiles.</p>

Please use bottle banks and wastepaper containers only on weekdays between 8 am and 8 pm and on Saturdays between 8 am and 7 pm to avoid noise that could disturb the residents.

## Yellow Bags

Yes! Put these items into your Yellow Bag:	No! Do NOT put these items into your Yellow Bag:
<p><b>Plastics:</b> Yoghurt and margarine pots, wrapping film, frozen food containers, styrofoam, milk and drink cartons, cleaning agent bottles and plastic bags</p> <p><b>Metals:</b> E.g. tins and cans, empty aerosols, tubes, bottle caps, aluminium</p>	<p>Paper, cardboard, glass, ashes, cigarette ends, nappies, sanitary articles, dust bags, cloths and sponges.</p> <p>Items containing harmful substances, such as batteries, paint and varnish.</p>

Please put the Yellow Bags down by the kerb by 6 am and only on the date of collection.

## Brown Bin

Yes! Put these items into your Brown Bin:	No! Do NOT put these items into your Brown Bin:
<p><b>Kitchen waste:</b> Fruit and vegetable scraps, leftovers, bones, eggshells, cardboard egg cartons, coffee grounds and filter paper, tea and tea bags, kitchen paper</p> <p><b>Garden refuse:</b> Leaves, cut grass, cuttings from hedges and bushes, plants, fruits and vegetables</p> <p><b>Miscellaneous:</b> Garden mould, pet litter, feathers and hair, wood shavings, sawdust, pieces of wood (not chemically treated)</p>	<p>Dust bags, cigarette ends, nappies, sanitary articles, coal ashes, rubber, dirt, glass, plastics, metals, glossy magazines, items containing harmful substances, such as batteries, paint, varnish</p> <p>... and please do not put any <b>plastic bags</b> into your Brown Bin!</p>

Undecorated Christmas trees are collected free of charge from several places in January. Please refer to your newspaper for the exact place and date.

Excess Brown Bin waste can be delivered to the Kompostwerk Raabrede (compost works) Mon – Fri 7.30 am to 5 pm and Sat 7.30 am – 1 pm.

Cuttings from trees and bushes will be collected free of charge from several places in spring and autumn. Please refer to your newspaper for the exact place and date.
